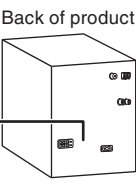

Caution for AC Mains Lead

For United Kingdom
For your safety, please read the following text carefully. This appliance is supplied with a moulded three pin mains plug for your safety and convenience. A 5-ampere fuse is fitted in this plug. Should the fuse need to be replaced please ensure that the replacement fuse has a rating of 5-ampere and that it is approved by ASTA or BSI to BS1362. Check for the ASTA mark or the BSI mark on the body of the fuse. If the plug contains a removable fuse cover you must ensure that it is refitted when the fuse is replaced. If you lose the fuse cover the plug must not be used until a replacement cover is obtained. A replacement fuse cover can be purchased from your local dealer.

CAUTION!
IF THE FITTED MOULDED PLUG IS UNSUITABLE FOR THE SOCKET OUTLET IN YOUR HOME THEN THE FUSE SHOULD BE REMOVED AND THE PLUG CUT OFF AND DISPOSED OF SAFELY. THERE IS A DANGER OF SEVERE ELECTRICAL SHOCK IF THE CUT OFF PLUG IS INSERTED INTO ANY 13-AMPERE SOCKET.

If a new plug is to be fitted please observe the wiring code as stated below. If in any doubt please consult a qualified electrician.

IMPORTANT
The wires in this mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:
Blue: Neutral, Brown: Live.
As these colours may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:
The wire which is coloured Blue must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter N or coloured Black or Blue.
The wire which is coloured Brown must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter L or coloured Brown or Red.

WARNING: DO NOT CONNECT EITHER WIRE TO THE EARTH TERMINAL WHICH IS MARKED WITH THE LETTER E, BY THE EARTH SYMBOL OR COLOURED GREEN OR GREEN/YELLOW. THIS PLUG IS NOT WATERPROOF—KEEP DRY.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Placement
Set the unit up on an even surface away from direct sunlight, high temperatures, high humidity, and excessive vibration. These conditions can damage the cabinet and other components, thereby shortening the unit's service life. Do not place heavy items on the unit.

Voltage
Do not use high voltage power sources. This can overload the unit and cause a fire. Do not use a DC power source. Check the source carefully when setting the unit up on a ship or other place where DC is used.

AC mains lead protection
Ensure the AC mains lead is connected correctly and not damaged. Poor connection and lead damage can cause fire or electric shock. Do not pull, bend, or place heavy items on the lead. Grasp the plug firmly when unplugging the lead. Pulling the AC mains lead can cause electric shock. Do not handle the plug with wet hands. This can cause electric shock.

Foreign matter
Do not let metal objects fall inside the unit. This can cause electric shock or malfunction. Do not let liquids get into the unit. This can cause electric shock or malfunction. If this occurs, immediately disconnect the unit from the power supply and contact your dealer. Do not spray insecticides onto or into the unit. They contain flammable gases which can ignite if sprayed into the unit.

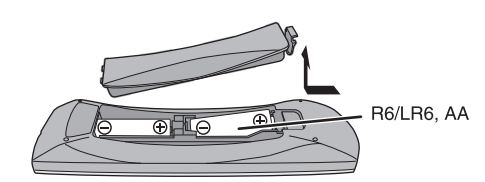
Service
Do not attempt to repair this unit by yourself. If sound is interrupted, indicators fail to light, smoke appears, or any other problem that is not covered in these instructions occurs, disconnect the AC mains lead and contact your dealer or an authorised service centre. Electric shock or damage to the unit can occur if the unit is repaired, disassembled or reconstructed by unqualified persons. Extend operating life by disconnecting the unit from the power source if it is not to be used for a long time.

PLACEMENT OF SPEAKERS

Speakers are designed identically so that no left or right channel orientation is necessary. You cannot take the front net off the speakers. **Use only the supplied speakers.** The combination of the main unit and speakers provide the best sound. Using other speakers can damage the unit and sound quality will be negatively affected. **Note:**
• Keep your speakers at least 10mm away from the system for proper ventilation.
• These speakers do not have magnetic shielding. Do not place them near televisions, personal computers or other devices easily influenced by magnetism.
• You can damage your speakers and shorten their useful life if you play sound at high levels over extended periods.
• Reduce the volume in the following cases to avoid damage.
– When playing distorted sound.
– When adjusting the sound quality.

Caution
• Use the speakers only with the recommended system. Failure to do so can damage the amplifier and speakers, and can cause fire. Consult a qualified service person if damage occurs or if a sudden change in performance is apparent.
• Do not attach these speakers to walls or ceilings.

PREPARING THE REMOTE CONTROL



Use alkaline or manganese batteries. Insert so the poles (+ and -) match those in the remote control. Aim at the remote control signal sensor, avoiding obstacles, at a maximum range of 7 m directly in front of the unit.

CAUTION
Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type recommended by the manufacturer. Dispose of used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions.

NOTE about using a DualDisc
The digital audio content side of a DualDisc does not meet the technical specifications of the Compact Disc Digital Audio (CD-DA) format so playback may not be possible.

NOTE on MP3
• Files are treated as tracks and folders are treated as albums.
• This unit can access up to 999 tracks, 255 albums and 20 sessions.
• Disc must conform to ISO9660 level 1 or 2 (except for extended formats).
• To play in a certain order, prefix the folder and file names with 3-digits numbers in the order you want to play them.

Limitations on MP3 play
• If you have recorded MP3 on the same disc as CD-DA, only the format recorded in the first session can be played.
• Some MP3s may not be played due to the condition of the disc or recording.
• Recordings will not necessarily be played in the order you recorded them.

MAINTENANCE

If the surfaces are dirty
To clean this unit, wipe with a soft, dry cloth.
• Never use alcohol, paint thinner or benzene to clean this unit.
• Before using chemically treated cloth, read the instructions that came with the cloth carefully.

AVOID INTERFERING WITH OTHER PANASONIC EQUIPMENT

Other Panasonic audio or video equipment may start functioning when you operate the unit using the supplied remote control.
You can operate this unit in another mode by setting the remote control operating mode to "REMOTE 2".
The main unit and remote control must be set to the same mode.
1 Press and hold [AUX] [5] on the main unit and [2] until the main unit's display shows "REMOTE 2".
2 Press and hold [OK] [3] and [2] for at least 2 seconds.
To change the mode back to "REMOTE 1", repeat steps 1 and 2 by replacing [2] with [1].

MAKING THE CONNECTIONS

Connect the AC mains lead only after all the other connections have been made.

Antenna connections
Place the antenna where reception is best.

FM indoor antenna
Adhesive tape

FM outdoor antenna
Rear panel of this main unit
FM outdoor antenna (not included)
75 Ω coaxial cable (not included)

AM loop antenna
Push

Stand the antenna up on its base.

For the United Kingdom
Use the antenna plug adaptor (included).

Note:
• If the radio reception is poor, use optional outdoor antenna. This antenna should be installed by a competent technician.
• Disconnect the outdoor antenna when the unit is not in use.
• Do not use the outdoor antenna during a lightning storm.
• Disconnect the FM indoor antenna.

Speaker connections

SPEAKERS
Connect the left (L) side in the same way

To household mains socket

AC mains lead connection

FOR THE UNITED KINGDOM ONLY READ THE CAUTION FOR AC MAINS LEAD ON THE LEFT BEFORE CONNECTION.

Insertion of connector
Even when the connector is perfectly inserted, depending on the type of inlet used, the front part of the connector may jut out as shown in the drawing. However there is no problem using the unit.

Appliance inlet → **Connector**

For your reference
To save power when the unit is not to be used for a long time, unplug it from the household mains socket. You will need to reset some memory items after plugging in the unit.

Note:
• The included AC mains lead is for use with this unit only.
• Do not use it with other equipment.
• Do not use an AC mains lead from other equipment.

CONNECTING TO OTHER EXTERNAL UNIT

You can connect to an analogue player with a built-in phone equaliser.
1 Press [AUX] [5] to select "AUX".
2 Play the external unit. (See the external unit's instruction manual.)

Level adjustment
You can select the sound input level of your external unit. You are recommended to set the input level as below:
NORMAL : For connection to TV, VCR, DVD Player
HIGH : For connection to digital audio player such as MP3 player

Press [INPUT LEVEL] [3] to select your desired setting.
HIGH ↔ NORMAL

Note:
• If there is high sound distortion when level "HIGH" is selected, the unit will automatically switch to "NORMAL".
• You can also manually select "NORMAL" if there is sound distortion.

DISCS

Playing discs

1 Press **[▲, OPEN/CLOSE]** **[6]** on the main unit to open the tray **[7]**.
The unit turns on, load a disc with the label facing up. Press **[▲, OPEN/CLOSE]** **[6]** again to close the tray **[7]**.

2 Press **[▶/II, CD]** **[13]** to start play.

Stop playback Press **[■]** **[4]** (stop) during play.

Pause play Press **[▶/II, CD]** **[13]** during play. Press again to resume play.

Skip album **[MP3]** Press **[▲/▼, ALBUM]** **[36]** to select the desired album during play or when in stop mode.

- This function does not work during RANDOM mode.

Skip tracks During play Press **[◀◀/▶▶]** **[11]**, or turn [TRACK] **[14]** to skip to your desired track.

While in stop mode Press **[◀◀/▶▶]** **[11]** followed by **[▶/II, CD]** **[13]** to skip and play your desired track.

Alternatively, turn [TRACK] **[14]** to skip and play your desired track.

- During random play (➡ see "Play Mode function"), you cannot skip to tracks which have been played.
- You cannot use [TRACK] **[14]** to skip track during random play.

[MP3] During 1-ALBUM and 1-ALBUM RANDOM mode, track skipping can only be done within the current album.

Search through tracks **[CD]** Press and hold **[◀◀/▶▶]** **[11]** during play or pause to search.

- During program play, or random play (➡ see "Play Mode function"), you can search only within the track.

Cancel program mode Press [PROGRAM] **[22]** in the stop mode.

Replay the program Press [PROGRAM] **[22]** then **[▶/II, CD]** **[13]**.

Add to the program **[CD]** In the stop mode, press **[▶▶/▶▶]** **[11]** and then repeat step 3.

[MP3] Repeat steps 3 to 5 in the stop mode.

Check program contents Press **[◀◀/▶▶]** **[11]** when "PGM" is displayed in the stop mode.

To check while programming, press [PROGRAM] **[22]** twice after "PGM" appears, then press **[◀◀/▶▶]** **[11]**.

[CD] The track number and program order are displayed.

[MP3] The program order is displayed followed by the album number and track number.

Clear the last track Press [DEL] **[21]** in the stop mode.

Clear all programmed tracks Press **[■]** **[4]** (clear) in the stop mode. "CLR ALL" is displayed. Within 5 seconds, press the button again to clear all tracks.

[MP3] The program order is displayed followed by the album number and track number.

Clear the last track Press [DEL] **[21]** in the stop mode.

Clear all programmed tracks Press **[■]** **[4]** (clear) in the stop mode. "CLR ALL" is displayed. Within 5 seconds, press the button again to clear all tracks.

[MP3] The program order is displayed followed by the album number and track number.

When playback ends The current play mode will be retained in memory until it is changed even if the unit is turned off.

Note: You cannot use program mode together with "Play Mode function".

- The play mode setting is cleared when you open the disc tray **[7]**.

Note: The program memory is cleared when you open the disc tray **[7]**.

Repeat play **[CD]** **[MP3]** You can repeat program play or other selected play mode.

Press [REPEAT] **[33]**. "ON REPEAT" and "Ⓞ" are displayed.

To cancel Press [REPEAT] **[33]** again. "OFF REPEAT" is displayed and "Ⓞ" is cleared.

Note: You can use repeat mode with "Program play" and "Play Mode function".

Press [MP3 INFO] **[37]** repeatedly during play or pause.
