



This appliance is supplied with a moulded three pin mains plug for your safety and convenience.

A 5-ampere fuse is fitted in this plug.

Should the fuse need to be replaced please ensure that the replacement fuse has a rating of 5ampere and that it is approved by ASTA or BSI to BS1362.

Check for the ASTA mark \circledast or the BSI mark $\ensuremath{\mathfrak{S}}$ on the body of the fuse.

If the plug contains a removable fuse cover you must ensure that it is refitted when the fuse is replaced.

If you lose the fuse cover the plug must not be used until a replacement cover is obtained.

A replacement fuse cover can be purchased from your local dealer.




The location of the fuse differ according to the type of AC mains plug (Figures A and B). Confirm instructions below.

Playable Discs/Files

- Before playback, finalize the disc on the equipment it was recorded on.
- It is not possible to play all the above-mentioned discs in some conditions because of:
 - The type of disc.
 - The condition of the recording.
 - The recording procedure.
 - How the files were made.
- In this manual, the word "file" and "track" is used alternately.

Video systems

This system can play discs with PAL and NTSC.

Tips for making data

MP3 (Extension: ".MP3", ".mp3")

- Standard, sampling frequency, and the bit rate: 32kHz, 44.1kHz, 48kHz
 32kbps - 320kbps (constant bit rate or variable bit rate).
- This system does not support ID3 tags.
- MP3 files may not be played in the recorded order. Do not make an empty folder. It may not work correctly.

JPEG (Extension: ".JPG", ".jpg", ".JPEG", ".jpeg")

- JPEG resolution is up to 2150 X 1432 (baseline) or 1400 x 900 (progressive).
- The unit only can play standard JPEG and cannot play loss free JPEG.

Standard JPEG format: For digital camera, network, etc.

Loss free JPEG format: Older type. Now rarely used.

DivX (Extension: ".DIVX", ".divx", ".AVI", ".avi")

- DivX files that are more than 2 GB or have no index may be fail to play correctly on this system.
- This system supports all resolutions until a maximum of 720 x 480 (NTSC)/720 x 576 (PAL).
- You can select a maximum of eight types of audio and subtitles on this system.

Discs that cannot be played

Blu-ray, HD DVD, AVCHD discs, DVD-RW version 1.0, DVD-Audio, DVD-ROM, CD-ROM, CDV, CD-G, SACD, Photo CD, DVD-RAM, and "Chaoji VCD" (including CVD, DVCD and SVCD) that do not conform to IEC62107.

- The unit cannot support the discs recorded using DVD Video Recording (DVD-VR) Format.
- There may be differences in the display sequence on the menu screen and computer screen.
- This system cannot play files recorded using packet writing.

DVD-R/RW

- Discs must conform to UDF bridge (UDF 1.02/ ISO9660).
- This system does not support multi-session. Only the default session can be played back.

CD-R/RW

- Discs must conform to ISO9660 level 1 or 2 (except for extended formats).
- Single-session disc can be played back. As for multi-session disc, only the first session can be played back.



A DualDisc could possibly not playback if the side of the digital audio content does not meet the technical specifications of the Compact Disc Digital Audio (CD-DA) format.







Preparation

Install and replace the batteries of remote control

- Risk of explosion! Keep battery(ies) away from heat, sunshine or fire. Never discard the battery in fire.
- Install the batteries so that the poles (+ and -) align with those in the remote control.
- Point the remote control at the remote control sensor, away from obstacles, at a maximum range of 7 m directly in front of the main unit.
- If you are not going to use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries.


Speaker connections

Use only the supplied speakers

The combination of the main unit and speakers give the best sound. If you use other speakers, the system may be damaged and the sound quality may be decreased.

Note:

- Put the speakers on a flat safe surface.
- These speakers do not have magnetic shielding. Do not put them near PCs or other equipment easily influenced by magnetism.
- When playing at high levels for a long period, it may cause damage to the system and decrease the life of the system.
- Decrease the volume in following conditions to prevent damage:
 - When playing the distorted sound.
 - When adjusting the sound quality.
- Connect only speakers with the same or higher impedance. Refer to "Specifications" for details.
- When connecting the speakers, make sure that "+" and "-" polarities are matched properly.





Select the best video connection that your TV supports.





Connecting AC mains lead

- Install this unit near the AC outlet where the AC mains plug can be easily reached.
- Connect the AC mains lead only after all the other connections have been made.
- Don't step on or pinch the AC mains lead, especially at plug, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the unit.
- Unplug the unit during lightning storms or when not be used for a long time.

Use the AC mains lead that matches the socket for the area you live in.







Press the **I** button again to stop the playback completely.

Note:

To save electricity, the power is turned off automatically if there is no button operation for about 10 minutes when playback is stopped completely or for about 30 minutes when playback is paused.

After the disc tray is opened for 3 minutes it will close automatically.



During playback press the ►/II button. Press the ►/II button again to continue playback.

Skip track (chapter)

- During playback press the I d button to skip back to the beginning of the current track.
 Press the button again immediately to skip back to the beginning of the previous track.
- During playback press the ▶▶I button to skip to the next track. A track is skipped each time the button is pressed.

During playback each time the $\blacktriangleleft \bullet$ or $\triangleright \bullet$ button is pressed the playback speed of reverse or forward will change as X 2 \rightarrow X 4 \rightarrow X 8 \rightarrow X 20.

The playback may not proceed at the selected speed in some conditions.

Press the ►/II button to return to normal playback.

- The sound is muted during fast playback. But for CD or MP3 there is sound output during playback of double-speed forward or reverse.
- For MP3 when searching to next file or previous file playback will start from the beginning of the file.
- For DivX in reverse direction when searching to the beginning of current file normal playback will start. In forward direction when searching to the end of current file, the unit goes to stop mode.

Slow playback

During playback press the SLOW \checkmark button to change to slow playback. Each time the SLOW \checkmark button is pressed the speed will change as $1/2 \rightarrow 1/3 \rightarrow 1/4 \rightarrow \dots \rightarrow 1/8$.

Press the ►/II button to return to normal playback.

Direct playback



In stop mode or during playback press the numeric button(s) to start directly from the track or chapter selected.

To select a 2-digit number press the ≥10 button first, and then press two numeric buttons consecutively. Some discs cannot be played back directly depending on the recorded conditions.

Selecting by on-screen information

DVD-V VCD CD MP3 DivX

In stop mode or during playback the playback can start directly from the selected title or chapter or time.

DivX: In stop mode only the selected track can be played back.



MP3, JPEG, DivX files playback

Insert a disc or connect a USB device recorded MP3, JPEG or DivX files to the unit. The file or disc which the unit can playback, refer to page 4 -5.

Select playback source. Refer to page12. To MP3 file, below picture appears on TV. Example:



A: Shows current file name B: Shows folder list C: Shows file list

The names of the files or folders named by selected language in the OSD LANGUAGE (refer to page11.) can be displayed on the TV.

How to select file:

Press the \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown button to select desired file, then press the OK button, playback starts.

To select the folder, press the \blacktriangleleft button to move the cursor to folder list, then press the \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown button to select desired folder.

How to select JPEG or DivX file:

- In above picture press the ◄ or ► button to move the cursor to D.
- Press the ◄ or ► button to select JPEG () or DivX (), then press the OK button to confirm. If there is no playable file the cursor cannot move.
- 3. Press the ▲ button to move the cursor to file list.





D.Bass effect

The sound from the speakers can output D.BASS effect.
